

They are all famous tv neighbors. Kimmy Gibbler was the annoying neighbor on *Full House*. Wilson W. Wilson Jr. was Tim Taylor's wise neighbor on *Home Improvement*. Mr. George Wilson was Dennis the Menace's unfortunate neighbor. And Fred Mertz was married to Ethel, Lucy and Ricky's landlord neighbors.

How many of your neighbors can you name? What do you know about them? Where do they work? How many kids? What do they struggle with? What can you help them with?

Real-life neighborhoods don't really work like they do on tv. Cosmo Kramer isn't going to bust into your apartment and say something completely off the wall. Barney Rubble isn't always available to go bowling. Lenny and Squiggy aren't going to try to get you to go along with their crazy schemes.

Chances are you probably don't know your neighbors all that well. You might know some of them. Maybe they've even been inside your house. As this culture continues to move forward, we know less and less of our neighbors.

Jesus had a different idea about neighbors and it was just as difficult to comprehend two thousand years ago as it is today. Jesus wanted us to love our neighbors. And he considered everyone a neighbor, not just the one's that live near us.

For the month of October, we'll be focusing on the theme of *neighbors*. We'll look at the definition of neighbor that Jesus gives. We'll go back to the Old Testament book of Leviticus and see what God says about our neighbors. We'll even look at what we should do if our neighbor sins.

Sometimes we find it difficult to love our neighbors, especially if they're different from us. They might support the wrong presidential candidate. They might not look like the 'right' kind of person. Maybe their skin is a different color, or their culture is too different, or they raise their kids to be bilingual so they can be a contributing member of our community.

I know it's hard. God knows it's hard. Perhaps that's why the Bible spends so much time on the subject.

It's also important. That's why Jesus repeated it and taught it in different ways. That's why we're spending so much time on it.

You see, by loving our neighbor, we can do more good in the world - more than any presidential candidate. Don't wait for someone else to change the world. Let's do it together. Right now. Right here.

You shall not hate in your heart anyone of your kin; you shall reprove your neighbor, or you will incur guilt yourself. You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against any of your people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the LORD. (Leviticus 19:17-18)




# **FLC Women of the ELCA**

Although pledged giving was under budget for August, the fiscal year ended \$31K over budget. FLC ended the year in the black which was much better than anticipated thanks to increased giving and cost savings with the Pastor share and transition to a permanent Lead Pastor. Maintenance/Building Fund continues to grow for large unexpected costs such HVAC, roof replacement, and deductibles. ELC will end with a loss for the fiscal year so budget adjusted. Although the new fiscal year is budgeted for a loss, with the re-engagement and support of the entire congregation, the hope is to return to a balanced budget.

# Planning...Giving...Growing...

You finally "got to it" and created an estate plan that outlines your final wishes on how you would like your assets shared upon your death. You've taken a significant step in ensuring your wishes are honored and your loved ones are cared for. You and your financial advisor have determined what financial vehicles will best manage your wishes. Occasionally reviewing this plan will be important to make sure any changes in your financial situation are captured and there have been no changes to your list of beneficiaries. You have done the hard work! However, your work is not yet finished.

The final step in estate planning is communicating the details of that plan with family members or charitable organizations you have listed as beneficiaries. Why is it important to share this information with those designated as beneficiaries?

- By sharing with loved ones your final wishes, this will help in reducing stress and avoid confusion and conflict. Communicating your plan will help family members better understand your wishes and accept your decisions.
- By knowing ahead of time your final wishes, your loved ones can make informed decisions during this stressful time or make medical decisions if necessary.
- By being transparent about your estate plan can prevent misunderstandings among family members. This can also ensure your wishes are carried out as intended.

Why is it important to share my plan details with those charitable organizations I have listed in my estate plan? Charitable organizations may want to show their appreciation and recognize you for your contribution while you are still alive. This maybe done in a variety of ways from a letter of appreciation to donor recognition awards, dinners, etc.

Whether you designate a percentage of your estate or a certain dollar amount depends on the organization. In many cases, such as First Lutheran Endowment, just notifying them of your intention is all that is required.

If you have included First Lutheran Endowment or First Lutheran Church in your estate plan we encourage you to let the church know by contacting Pastor Greg or Wendy Grosse. First Lutheran respects your privacy and will not share this information without your permission.
