Several years ago, I realized that vowing each and every year to spread fertilizer and weed killer on my lawn, according to the directions and schedule of the manufacturer, was just a lie I told myself. I started each spring with great intentions, but then life happens and I would miss the second round of whatever it was I was supposed to spread. And then the third. And then the lawn looked worse than it did last year. And then I vowed I would do better next year. You get the picture.

I finally gave in and hired someone to do it.

But then my lawn looked horrible. When you hire someone to spread weed killer on your lawn, you know what happens? The weeds die. If your lawn is weeds, and they die, there is nothing left. There were huge dead patches and bare spots. Our lawn was big; we had a full-size empty lot on the side of our house. Big brown spots on a big lawn are not easily hidden. That first year was rough.

But the second year was better. And the third.

I also realized something else, when you focus on the weeds, all you see is weeds.

When you focus on mistakes, all you see is mistakes. When you focus on faults, all you see is faults. When you focus on imperfections, all you see is imperfections. When you focus on the negative, all you see is the negative.

The Pharisees, who focused on enforcing the Jewish law, only saw violations of the law.

When you focus on the law, you miss the grace. When you focus on the way things should be, you miss what could be.

As we approach Easter, our focus, rightfully, belongs on our sin. It is our sin that brings us to the Cross. It was sin that brought Moses to the mountain to get the 10 Commandments. And when we focus on sin, all we see is sin mine, yours, everyone's. It is our sin that needs our attention. Your neighbor's sin needs your neighbor's attention, not your attention.

Easter changes our focus. We go from the ugly horror of the cross to a joy-filled sunrise, a surprise-filled garden, a hope-filled world, and a promise fulfilled.

When we focus on joy, we are filled with joy. When we focus on hope, we are filled with hope. When we focus on grace, we are filled with grace. When we focus on mercy, we are filled with mercy. When we focus on love, we are filled with love.

So where is your focus? Do you see crabgrass, clover, and dandelions? Or do you see daffodils, tulips, and lilacs?

Do you see the pain and suffering of the cross? Or do you see the grace and glory of the empty tomb?

February pledged giving was drastically stronger than last year with continued RMDs contributions coming in. As a result, pledged giving has exceeded budget YTD by \$52.7K. February ended with a profit vs a budgeted loss. YTD there is a positive bottom line that has exceeded budget by \$60K although it remains \$10K lower than last year at this time. March is continuing strong which should end with the similar bottom line to last year even with the unbudgeted HVAC expenses. With all the exciting changes and additions happening, we will continue to transition accounts to better accommodate and track these changes for next year's budget. FLC is blessed in so many ways including financially to support the missions and ministries of FLC.
